CASE MANAGEMENT ORDER


UPON IT APPEARING that it is appropriate, pursuant to Rule 18A.01(b) of the *Rules of the Supreme Court, 1986*, to give direction as to the procedure to govern the future course of the proceeding and, in particular, that the proceeding would benefit from continuous case management by the same judge.

IT IS THIS DAY ORDERED that this proceeding shall, until further order, be subject to case management to be conducted in accordance with Rule 18A, and that:

1. The Honourable Justice William Goodridge is designated and shall act as the case management judge with respect to the proceeding;
2. The Honourable Justice Alphonsus Faour is designated and shall act as the alternate case management judge in place of Justice Goodridge in the event of his inability to act as the case management judge.
3. All subsequent applications in the proceeding shall be made to the case management judge in the first instance;
4. Any party may initiate a case management meeting by seeking an appointment with the case management judge in his or her chambers on notice to the other party, with a view to resolving, through discussion, issues in contention between the parties and with a view to receiving directions for the future course of the proceeding, including the setting of time schedules. In the event a case management meeting does not resolve the matters in contention through discussion and agreement, either party or

the judge on his or her own motion may request that the matter be moved into applications court for adjudication before the case management judge or another judge as may be appropriate.
